THE SPECIALIST CRITICAL CARE CENTRE AT LLANFRECHFA

At the Community Council meeting held on 11th January 2017, Mr Julian Hayman, Aneurin Bevan Health Board Engagement Team, provided an update on the Specialist Critical Care Centre (SCCC) at Llanfrechfa Grange.

The Welsh Government has given approval for work to begin and groundworks are due to start in July 2017. Building work is scheduled for February 2018 with the hospital scheduled to open in 2020/21.

The SCCC will be for emergency care and the most serious illness such as:

- Suspected stroke
- Loss of consciousness
- Persistent and severe chest pain
- Sudden shortness of breath
- Severe abdominal pain
- Severe blood loss
- Serious road traffic accidents

There will be no walk in A & E Department at the SCCC and the Royal Gwent Hospital and Nevill Hall Hospital will continue to have in-patient beds, carry out surgery for routine (non-life threatening) conditions and outpatient services.

Admissions to the SCCC Emergency Department will be primarily by Ambulance and there will be a helipad at the hospital.

The Torfaen Local Development Plan continues to reserve the land for housing to the right of the Llanfrechfa Grange hospital drive. However the Health Board is not aware of any actual plans to build houses at present.

MOBILE PHONE RECEPTION IN PONTHIR

As most residents will know the mobile phone reception in Ponthir is not the best.

On a number of occasions we have contacted various mobile networks to complain about poor coverage but all too often have been told that they have received no or very few complaints from residents. Any resident who experiences poor mobile phone reception should contact their provider in order to highlight the poor reception experienced in Ponthir.

On a positive note following correspondence with Vodaphone and EE we have been informed that Vodaphone are looking to bring better outdoor coverage in the next few weeks once improvement works have been undertaken on a nearby mast and they are planning further improvements within the next 6 to 12 months. EE have also noted our concerns and their technical department are currently investigating these issues and will contact the Council once their investigations are complete.



PONTHIR CHILDREN'S PLAY AREA PROJECT

In September we were finally able to fully open the upgraded Ponthir Play Area after the council's most ambitious project to date.

The $\pm 32,500$ investment upgraded the paths and seating as well as the installation of junior swings and climbing frame. We hope this facility will be enjoyed by the youngsters of the village for many more years to come.

OGL ALLOW HAPPENED WEAKING THAT THE ALL AND THE

PRECEPT 2017-18

The only funding available to Ponthir Community Council is the Precept which forms part of the Community Charge collected by Torfaen County Borough Council from your council tax.

This year we have requested that the Precept for the Ponthir Community Area be increased by 2.5% for the next financial year.

In real terms this will mean an increase of 38p per year for a Band A property gradually rising to a £1.34 rise for a property in Band I.

The cost per household varies but for 2017/18 it will be based on £23.53 per annum for a Band D property.

We remain committed to keeping the Precept low, minimising administrative waste and continuing to maximise our investment in community projects.
