Ponthir Village Clean Up Event

This event took place at 6.30pm on the 27th May. It was a very successful evening with a team of ten volunteers taking part. The team consisted mainly of members of Ponthir Community Council and their families, plus two additional volunteers from Ponthir.

In just under two hours we managed to remove 31 bin bags full of weeds, silt and rubbish from along the main road through the village. During the event, time was also spent planting summer flowering plants in the village planters including the four new planters that have been installed on Caerleon Road near the pedestrian crossing and opposite the entrance to Lamb Lane. This was the second successful Village Clean Up Event organised by Ponthir Community Council in the run up to the judging for the Best Kept Village Competition. We plan to make this an annual or possibly twice yearly event if we have sufficient offers of support from residents.

Police Matters

Anti-Social Behaviour

Anti-social behaviour around the area of the Village Hall was set as a police priority for Ponthir. Over the past few months, Neighbourhood Officers have been patrolling and monitoring this area for any persons or vehicles acting in an anti-social manner. Residents can dial 101 if they witness incidents of this nature.

Community Speedwatch

At a meeting regarding speeding along Caerleon Road, a suggestion of a 'Community Speedwatch' was made by Gwent Police.

Community Speedwatch is a community led initiative and aims to educate drivers about the dangers of speeding. The scheme operates on roads with speed limits of 40 mph or below. Community volunteers work alongside Gwent Police officers or Community Support Officers to identify vehicles exceeding the speed limit. Roadside volunteers are provided with highvisibility jackets, roadside signs and are trained to use the equipment and record details of offending vehicles.

Gwent Police are hoping to find volunteers willing to take part in this activity. This would give residents an insight into their perception of speed and the actual speed of drivers which may help with their concerns regarding this road.

Voice for Youth

We are looking for two Youth Representatives for the Council, aged 16 to 25, who would be a voice for youth in the community.

As part of the Community Youth Representative's role they would be expected to regularly attend the Community Council's monthly meetings, which are currently held on the second Wednesday of the month at 7pm at Ponthir District Sports Club, and provide a youth view on all matters before the council. These appointments will be for a period of 12 months.

Play Area Update

When the Community Council decided to undertake a community project we set aside an initial budget of £5K.

In June 2014 the Children's Play Area project was voted for by residents as the preferred project.

Initial discussions were held with Play Wales -an independent charity that provides advice and guidance for these types of projects. However, it soon became apparent that the potential costs involved were significantly higher than budgeted.

Initial discussions with Torfaen County Borough Council were both protracted and initially non-committal. However, recent discussions have been good. Not only have TCBC been supportive they have also found a set of junior swings which they are providing for the project. The total budget now allocated to this project is $\pounds 15K$ and we are currently engaging with a number of contractors to see what can be achieved for this amount.

The Community Council recognises that the development of the Play Area is a long term project, one which will be a primary objective of the Council for the future. We are treating this as the first stage and are actively seeking additional grant funding to continue making improvements.
